Socially Useful Productive Work

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Annual Report on Socially Useful Productive Work (SUPW) - 2019-2020

The National Education Commission also known as Kothari Commission (1964-66) pointed out that there should be Work Experience followed by vocationalization of education in the school system. It was stated that the curriculum of school education should be directly linked with the productivity so as to contribute to our National Development. So it was proposed to implement the concept of work experience in Indian schools. It also conceived by our leaders during the national movement for freedom and as propounded-by Mahatma Gandhi has its genesis in work-based education. He was of the opinion that if education is based on socially useful productive work, it would be an instrument for personality development and social transformation.

The Review committee also known as Ishwarbhai Patel committee was appointed in 1977 to examine ten-year school system, in which the committee recommended the term "socially useful productive work" (SUPW) to work experience (WE) and recommended that SUPW to be an integral part of curriculum at all stages of school education. In the light of recommendations of committee SUPW was introduced at the school level in different states and Union Territories. It has been introduced and implemented under different names, such as Craft education (1937), work Experience (1967) and then socially useful productive work (1977).


The SUPW was works practiced on the basis of following objectives.

- a) Familiarize with the different productive activities in his community.
- b) Understand the scientific principles involved in various forms of work.
- c) To acquire knowledge of sources of raw materials and different tools and equipment used in the production of goods and services.
- d) Understand utility of Productive work and services to community.
- e) Understand the process of planning and organization of productive work.
- f) Develop an awareness of social problems.
- g) Develops an understanding to solve the problems and come up with new ideas and innovations.

As per academic work year 2019-20, the student teachers given hands-on experience with demonstration on various types of skills through social useful production work classes. In these classes the Teacher educators and the student teachers themself act as resource persons and demonstrate, explain the making of various handicrafts and their use. The SUPW work was planned as per practice:

- College has facilitated SUPW practices every Saturday in a week.
- College provides SUPW materials for productive works and some low cost productive works student teachers were informed to bring needful materials from home.
- In each classes college introduces a resource persons and if student teachers have such skills they were also performed as resource person of the class.
- The active participation and involvement of each student in this class were assessed by the mentor teacher and grades were given at the end of the course.

Required Materials :Previously print taken A4 size sheet, Scissor, Cutter, Gum Scale.

Method: The procedures of preparation of envelops are as follows.

- 1. Take print out of Required information with proper alignment on A4 Size sheet.
- 2. Fold left 1.5Cm, right 2Cm top 5Cm and bottom 5.5 Cm.
- 3. Make proper shape and cut the extra parts of the paper.
- 4. Gum it properly and allow it for some time.
- 5. Now 26 Cm length and 10 Cm breadth sized envelop is ready to use.

Cover the stem of the flower with green coloured tape. Now attractive different coloured flowers are ready to decoration.

Required Materials: Paraffin wax, thread role, candle making mould, vessel, stove

Procedure: Take the paraffin wax flakes in vessel. Heat the vessel containing wax on stove. Tie the thread properly on centre of the mould. Pour the heated paraffin wax slowly with the help of thread. Let the mould cooling for some time. Later again fill the paraffin wax 2 to 3 times up to the mark. After cooling the mould completely separate the candle from the mould. Now the candle is ready to use.

Procedure:In order to make three bags two meters of cloth is used. The cloth is cut into required shape of dimension of 40cm. height and 45cm. width. Initially the cloth was cut into required shape, later it is stitched in to the shapes according to our dimensions as mentioned above. For holdings of the bags, 50 cms length and 6 cms width cloth is used for making each bag. All student teachers involved whole heartedly in making 150 bags.



Procedure: Dilute half Kg of Fevicol gum with one liter of water. Add 5 Kg of terracotta powder with diluted Fevicol gum. Make proper texture of paint with adding required quantity of water. Apply the paint on pots and plates 2 - 3 times. Allow it dry for few time.





- Mark the required mask shape on hard sheet.
- Make mark on the cloth with the help of hard sheet already prepared previously by cloth marker.
- Cut the cloth as marked with the help of scissor.
- Take four cuts stitch the layers one by one as shown in the image.
